## **Questions:**

- 1. Icebreaker question: Have you ever been duped by a scam? What happened? How did it affect you?
- 2. The sermon focused on the importance of truth in standing against the enemy's lies. What do you remember about each of the main points? What stood out to you or impacted you?
- 3. Read Exodus 2:11-15
  - a) Moses had grown up as a prince of Egypt. Why do you think he tried to intervene in the fight between the two Hebrews? (see Acts 7:25 and Hebrews 11:24-25)
  - b) What was the one Hebrew man's response to Moses? How do you think these words might have affected Moses' view of himself?
  - c) To what degree do you think that other people's perspectives of you have affected your view of reality?
- 4. Read Exodus 3:1-11 (this event happens forty years after Moses killed the Egyptian in Exodus 2)
  - a) How do you think you would respond if you experienced God in such a supernatural way?
  - b) How does God describe himself in verse 6? How might this have affected Moses' understanding of the truth about himself?
  - c) What was God calling Moses to do?
  - d) How might this new calling relate to Moses' sense of call forty years earlier?
  - e) What was Moses' response to God in Exodus 3:11? Compare these words to the words spoken in Exodus 2:14. What do you notice?
  - f) Have you ever felt called by God? How has that calling turned out? Has it been shut down in some way?
- 5. Read Exodus 3:11-14
  - a) Moses asks the question, "Who am I...?" What was God's interesting answer?
  - b) How does encountering God change our understanding of truth?
- 6. Spend some time praying that God would help you see reality according to truth as He defines it. Ask Him to break any and all lies from your life. And pray for any specific needs in your group.
