


You Will Not Fear (Psalm 91) February 28, 2021 Discussion Notes

Questions:

1. What were some of the fears you dealt with as a child?
2. What are some of the fears you deal with now?
3. The sermon was based on Psalm 91. What stands out to you in this passage? (Feel free to reread it if needed)
4. Did anything in the sermon stand out to you? Do you have any questions?
5. Take some time to read Daniel 3:16-30 (King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon had commanded everyone to bow down to a large statue he had made, but Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego refused)
 - a) What was their understanding of what would happen to them after disobeying the king?
 - b) How do you think they were able to be so bold? (refer to the first two chapters of Daniel. Also see Isaiah 43:2, a passage they might have been familiar with)
 - c) How did God use the faith of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego?
 - d) Do you think you would have been able to stand up to Nebuchadnezzar like these young men did? Why or why not?
 - e) In what area of your life is it most difficult for you to stand by your Christian beliefs? Why?
 - f) Why do you think God rescued these three men, but allowed others (like Stephen, the first Christian martyr) to die?
 - g) If God chose not to rescue you from intense personal suffering, how would that affect your faith?
6. Read Proverbs 3:25-26
 - a) What are we promised in this passage?
 - b) What are we not promised?
 - c) Are you willing to submit to the command in v. 25 and live by it?
7. Pray for each other that all fear would be cast down. Pray for boldness to stand for Christ even when it is costly. And pray for any other specific needs in your group.
