

Ephesians Part 4 – Seated with Christ February 27, 2022 Discussion Notes

Questions:

1. Icebreaker question: What are the best seats you've ever had at a musical, concert, sporting event, or other special gathering? How did you get the seats? What was the experience like?
2. The sermon focused on what it means to be seated with Christ in heavenly places. What do you remember about each of the main points? What stood out to you or impacted you?
3. Read Psalm 110:1-7
 - a) What simple instruction does the Lord offer His anointed one? (110:1)
 - b) By whose power would the kingdom of God's anointed one be established? (110:1-4)
 - c) How will the Lord provide for His people? (110:1-5)
 - d) What did the psalm writer mean when he said that the Lord would extend the scepter of His chosen one? (110:2)
 - e) According to the psalm writer, how will God demonstrate His presence? (110:5-6)
 - f) What does this psalm reveal to us about God's authority?
 - g) What does this psalm reveal to us about God's reliability?
 - h) In what area of your life have you hesitated to rely on God?
 - i) How do you think a Christian's methods for solving problems should differ from the techniques of unbelievers?
4. Read Matthew 22:41-46
 - a) What passage of Scripture was Jesus quoting?
 - b) What point was Jesus making about himself?
5. Read Acts 2:32-41 (this is part of Peter's sermon on the Day of Pentecost). What aspects of the sermon do you see in this passage?
6. Which aspect of being seated with Christ is hardest for you to accept? Why?
7. Spend some time praying for each other. Pray for the eyes of your hearts to be opened to understand the reality of your position in Christ. Also, pray for Ukraine and all the world right now.
