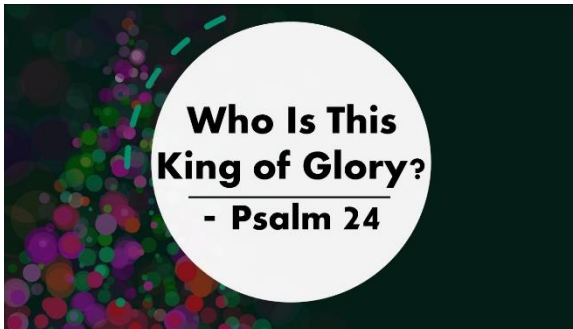


Who Is This King of Glory? (Psalm 24)

February 21, 2021 Discussion Notes

Everyone is encouraged to bring a Bible

(Phone apps are good for reading together in the same translation. Study Bibles give help with interpretation.)



Questions:

1. Is there a friend or family member who you really miss (because you haven't seen them for a while)? What is something that you appreciate about them?
2. Read Psalm 42:2. Have you been feeling this way about God lately? Why or why not?
3. The sermon was based on Psalm 24. Review the points in the outline above. What in the sermon stood out to you? Do you have any questions?
4. Take a few minutes to read 1 Chronicles 13:6-12
 - a) Why did Uzzah die? (see Numbers 4:15, Exodus 25:14-15, and Numbers 7:8-9)
 - b) Do you struggle with the harshness of what God did? Why or why not?
 - c) What stands out to you about the worship time David and the people had in verse 8? Why was God apparently not pleased? (discuss; then see 1 Samuel 15:22 and Matthew 15:7-9)
 - d) What kind of worship do you think God is looking for today?
5. Read 1 Chronicles 15:1-2 and 1 Chronicles 15:12-15 (where David later tries bringing the ark of the covenant into Jerusalem again)
 - a) What lesson had David learned?
 - b) Do you think that this made Uzzah's death worth it? Why or why not?
6. Read 2 Samuel 6:13-22 (many believe that Psalm 24 was written for this occasion)
 - a) What do you think of the way David worshiped God?
 - b) Why do you think his wife, Michal, despised him?
 - c) In light of David's response to her, how unrestrained should we be in worship? Can this be taken too far? (see 1 Corinthians 14:23)
 - d) How can we appropriately express our praise, gratitude, and love for the King of Glory in worship while also being sensitive to others?
7. Pray that nothing would hinder you from worshiping in a way that honors the Lord. Pray for any who are feeling distant from God. And pray for any other specific needs in your group.
