HOW TO BE A BLESSING HELP THOSE WHO ARE IN NEED EVEN IF THEY DON'T DESERVE IT ILLUSTRATE FAITH AND WORSHIP REVEAL THE ONE TRUE GOD

Questions:

- 1. Can you remember a time when someone did something for you that greatly encouraged you? What did they do and how did it impact you?
- 2. What do you remember about each of the main points of the sermon? (seen above). What in the sermon challenged you? Do you have any questions to bring up?
- 3. Read Matthew 25:14-30
 - a) What excuse did the third servant give for not investing his talent?
 - b) How did the master respond to this?
 - c) With what talents or resources has God entrusted you?
 - d) In what ways can you be a "good and faithful" servant?
 - e) What should you do if you fear that you are falling short? (for a healthy perspective, see Romans 8:1, 1 Peter 5:6-7, Ephesians 6:19-20, Colossians 1:29)
 - f) What resource do you need to commit to Christ's use at this time in your life?
- 4. Read Matthew 25:34-40
 - a) According to this passage, what are some practical ways that we can serve people's physical needs?
 - b) In what ways do you see Christians serving people's needs in this way?
 - c) In what ways do you think we can do better?
 - d) How can we minister to people's emotional needs? (see 1 Thessalonians 5:14-19)
 - e) How can we minister to people's spiritual needs? (see 2 Corinthians 5:17-20)
- 5. Read Jonah 1:1-3. Jonah is being sent to the Assyrians, a brutal and wicked people.
 - a) Why do you think Jonah ran from the Lord?
 - b) Now read Jonah 4:1-2. Jonah is not happy about God forgiving the Assyrians in Ninevah. Why is he upset?
 - c) Are there people that you feel that God should never forgive? Why or why not?
 - d) Read Jonah 4:10-11. What was God's perspective of the Ninevites?
 - e) How do you think God feels about the people of Iran? What about people who are members of ISIS?
 - f) Read Acts 7:59-60. How was Stephen able to have the perspective that he did?
 - g) How can we better develop God's heart for the people of this world, even if we see them as enemies?
- 6. Read Acts 16:22-25
 - a) How do you think Paul and Silas were able to behave the way they did in their situation?
 - b) How do you think the other prisoners were impacted by their example?
 - c) How can we get better at complaining less and praising more?
 - d) Now read Acts 16:26-34. What was the result of Paul and Silas' witness?
- 7. Share prayer requests and pray together. Pray for a heart for the poor and needy around you. Pray for God's perspective of those you tend to dislike. Ask for His power to use your gifts to serve Him.
