


## Who Is Jesus: The Son of God (Mark 6)

#### Questions:

1. Has your faith in Christ ever wavered since you first believed? What happened?
2. The sermon looked at Mark chapter 6 (the feeding of the 5000 and Jesus walking on water). What do these stories tell us about Jesus? What stood out to you? Do you have any questions?
3. Read Hebrews 1:1-4
  - a) According to this passage, who is Jesus? (this passage speaks about the “Son of God”, but starting in Hebrews 2:9 we see that this is referring to Jesus)
  - b) Why do you think the author of Hebrews made such a point of Christ’s deity to these Hebrew Christians?
  - c) Takes some time to discuss each of Jesus’ attributes described in this passage. Which attribute is most amazing or interesting to you?
4. Read John 20:24-31
  - a) Why do you think Thomas doubted that Jesus was alive, even though there were so many eyewitnesses around him?
  - b) What did Jesus do for Thomas?
  - c) What did Jesus tell Thomas about doubt?
  - d) Who did Thomas acknowledge Jesus to be?
  - e) Do you think Thomas felt chastised by Jesus? Why or why not?
  - f) What should Christians do if they experience some doubts?
  - g) What good can come out times of wrestling with doubt?
  - h) The word “blessed” in the Bible means “happy”. Why do you think those who have more faith experience more happiness?
  - i) In verse 31, John explains why he wrote his gospel. What was his ultimate purpose?
5. Read Hebrews 2:1-4
  - a) What advice does this passage give to Christians?
  - b) What is the warning in v. 3?
  - c) What evidence is provided that the message of salvation is true?
6. Pray for each other that your faith would be strong. Pray for those you know who do not believe in Jesus and ask God to use us. And pray for any other specific needs in your group.
